# 2018 Adams County Open Horse Show Series *Performance*

## Performance Show Rules

Governed by the current Colorado 4-H Rule Book.

**All enrolled Adams County 4-H contestants 18 & Under are REQUIRED to wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet with a safety harness for all divisions and disciplines. Open and non-4-H members are strongly encouraged to wear an ASTM/SEI approved helmet with safety harness in the English & Western Divisions.** All contestants are required to wear proper English or Western attire, including boots, pants, and long sleeved collared shirts (chest and midriff must be covered). Please refer to the CO 4-H Rule Book for additional tack/attire specifications.

**Hunter Hack** warm up times are from 7:30 – 8:00 AM. Participants may be dismissed for safety reasons at the discretion of the judge or show management. Helmet safety harnesses are required for ALL exhibitors showing in Hunter Hack classes.

**Class entries** – Exhibitors can enter multiple horses into the individually scored classes (English Riding Control, Western Riding, Reining, and Trail). Each horse/rider combo must be registered and have an assigned number. Points are accumulated on a one horse/one rider basis.

**Walk-Trot** classes are for riders who cannot yet canter/lope. Trail and Showmanship Walk-Trot classes may be shown in either English or Western attire/tack. Walk-Trot Equitation and Walk-Trot Horsemanship classes will be a combination of rail and pattern work. Walk-Trot exhibitors cannot cross-enter into any other age division or classes. Walk-Trot exhibitors may ride with 2 hands on a snaffle bit for any aged horse, or 1 hand with a shank bit.

**Novice** classes are for novice riders, not novice horses. Qualified exhibitors include 4-H members not yet at Level 2, or open exhibitors who are in their first few years of showing and haven't won more than 10 blue ribbons. Novice riders can and are encouraged to cross-enter into other age divisions or classes.

**Junior Horse Pleasure** is offered as a non-point class. Horse must be 5 years of age or younger, and riders must be at least 8 years of age. Riders may use either Western or English tack/attire.

**Trail** classes, with the exception of Walk-Trot, are to be shown in Western tack/attire. The trail course will be open from 12PM—3PM only, and exhibitors will work their pattern when time permits for their schedule. The main arena classes take precedence.

**NO REFUNDS! An open signed check or credit card form must be on file before numbers will be distributed. Credit Cards will be processed at the end of the day with a 4% service charge added.**

**Co-Op Membership - This Co-Op is an opportunity for exhibitors wishing to earn Year End Discipline and Overall Championship Awards. Membership is required before points begin to accrue, and is not retroactive. Membership is not required for Daily Hi-Point Awards. Individual Membership is \$15 annually, or a Family (2+) is \$30 annually.**

**Daily High Point** winners will be announced. Divisions for the daily high point include: Walk-Trot 18 & Under, Walk-Trot 19 & Over, Novice 18 & Under, Novice 19 & Over, 8-10, 11-13, 14-18, 19 & Over. Overall placings (ie: Top 5, Top 10) and awards will be based on number of exhibitors in each age division. Points will be maintained and accumulated on a one horse/one rider basis.

**Walk-Trot and Novice Overall Year End Championship** - points earned in each Performance show, based on one horse/one rider combo, will accumulate toward the 2018 Adams County Horse Show Series Division awards.

**English Discipline & Western Discipline Year End Championship** - points earned in each Performance show, based on one horse/one rider combo, will accumulate toward the 2018 Adams County Horse Show Series Division awards. These awards will be given for 8-10, 11-13, 14-18, and 19 & Over season winners.

**Overall Year End Championship** – points earned from all shows in the series, based on one horse/one rider combo, will count toward the 2018 Adams County Horse Show Series Overall Championship awards. Awards will be given for age groups: 8-10, 11-13, 14-18, and 19 & Over season winners.
